	Troop Leader (Troops must have 2 non-related adults in Leader/Co-Leader positions)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Serves as the main council contact for the troop. *Keeps troop records. *Works with co-leader and girls to plan and run meetings/activities. *Attends troop meetings and service unit meetings.
	Troop Co-Leader (Troops must have 2 non-related adults in Leader/Co-Leader positions)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Works with troop leader and girls to plan meetings/activities. *Attends troop meetings and may attend service unit meetings with troop leader.
	Troop Treasurer	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Gives guidance with regard to troop financial affairs, such as product sales and money earning activities; keeps accurate troop records and makes sure financial reports are submitted in a timely manner. *May be the second signer on the troop checking account.
	Troop Fall Product Manager	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Manage and coordinate troop participation in the Fall Sale Program. *Attends council training for Fall Product Sale *Trains girls and parents/guardians at troop meeting. *Confirms orders with parents/guardians and enters all data into Nut-E
	Troop Cookie Manager	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Manage and coordinate troop participation in the Cookie Sale *Attends council training for Cookie Sale *Trains girls and parents/guardians at troop meeting. *Confirms orders with parents/guardians and enters all data into SNAP
	Arts & Crafts Coordinator	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Works with troop leaders to plan and complete crafts and activities that the girls have chosen. *May shop for craft supplies.
	Service Project Coordinator	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Helps troop leaders and girls plan and compete Take Action projects (community service)
	Outdoor Program Coordinator	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Helps plan for camp outing(s) with girl and adult input. *Attends campouts. *Promotes resident and day camp. *Submits Troop Trip Application.
	Transportation Coordinator	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Responsible for securing transportation for girls for field trips and outing. *Ensures all council and safety checkpoints are in place.
	Refreshments/Snacks Coordinator	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Coordinates refreshments/snacks for troop meetings and other activities as needed. However, not responsible for bringing all refreshments/snacks.
	Telephone/E-Mail Coordinator	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Contacts girls or parents/guardians as needed for troop meeting cancellations, troop updates/reminders, etc. *Serves as the emergency contact when the troop is traveling.
	Troop Shopper	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Shop for troop supplies as needed.
	Recognition Coordinator	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Work with troop leaders to ensure that all girls and adults receive proper recognition.
	Daycare	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Provides daycare to troop leaders during troop meetings and activities.
	CPR/First Aider (*copy of current card is needed)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Provide First Aid/CPR for troop if activity requires it.
	Certified Lifeguard (*copy of certification needed)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *Provide Lifeguarding for troop if activity requires it.
